

Do Our Values Have Our Attention?

During the past few months, we've been participating, first as individuals and now as a congregation, in the Nourishing Vocation Project, to deepen our understanding of God's call in our lives and our life together as *Bethel*. We've talked about aligning our attention with our values as a congregation, but just what are those values?

On November 19, Rev. Dr. Char Cox and NVP Fellow, Emily King-Nobles conducted a workshop (pictured) for the congregation to determine what our values might be. The results of that workshop revealed that our very highest priority is worship and music. A close second is a welcoming fellowship and compassionate community, followed by education for children, youth and adults. There was strong consensus among these choices, but it was clear that additional values were in the hearts of our members as well, such as outreach, service, stewardship and more.

As we move into a new year planning programs and activities for the congregation, we can give attention to our values and how they show up in our work together. We will revisit these values in Eastertide and announce our top five for the coming year. In the time of Christmas and following Epiphany, our focus will be *attentiveness*. Does our attention align with the values we've prioritized?

Happy New Year, Bethel!

I've never really been one for New Year's resolutions. It's not that I have never aspired to improve or could stand to improve in one way or another (God and my friends and family know I am far from perfect), but I've never really used the "New Year" to inspire a "new me" or, rather, something new about myself. This New Year, however, I think I might make a resolution to be more attentive. Allow me to elaborate.

I have this paper weight on my office desk. I've had it for so long, I can't remember how I got it. Engraved on it is the famous adage "Be the change you wish to see in the world" (not a Mahatma Gandhi quote, by the way). BEFRIENDERS by Marci Groenewold

Pay attention! our teachers insist, as they give out directions for the next classroom assignment. Pay attention! the car behind us honks, reminding us to stay in our lane. Pay attention. In Paul's letter to the Ephesians as rendered by "The Message", Chapter 4, verse 3, invites us to pay attention by "pouring yourselves out for each other in acts of love, alert at noticing differences and quick at mending fences."

For BeFrienders, "paying attention" is known as attending. "Attending is one of the key behaviors of active listening. Attending means paying close attention and being sensitive to cues in yourself and others that indicate what is going on. It means to listen with the eyes and heart as well as the ears. Through attending, BeFrienders create a listening space in which we can be fully present to the other, respect silence, and maintain our focus on the here and now." (BeFriender Training Workbook)

Paying attention requires patience. We must be silent; taking the time to get to know the other person and allowing them the time they need to express their thoughts without judgment. This requires a non-anxious presence that blocks out all other distractions. When we focus on another in this way, we allow ourselves to view them through the lens of Christ's love. By getting to know others, we also discover more about ourselves and our calling to be more of what God intended for us to be -- loving and sensitive to the hopes, dreams, and needs of each other.

Notice that the same letters in the word Silent are in the word Listen. Silent=Listen

ARLA's New Section of the Library

ARLA (Anti-Racism Learning and Advocacy) has started a new section in the Bethel Library! So far we have some Native American-related books for all ages and some African American-related books.

The first of two books we are recommending this month are *I'm Still Here*, a memoir with practical help for the reader. It's an engaging, easily readable memoir of parts of Channing Brown's life. A young, black, Christian woman, she describes her experiences in American society and offers practical help in being an anti-racist.

Neither Wolf Nor Dog: On Forgotten Roads with an Indian Elder by Kent Michael Nerburn leads the reader through Indian country with remarkable descriptions of the Dakota west. A Native American elder asked Nerburn, a white college professor, to record his story and teachings so whites could understand. The conversations they have reveal insights into Lakota culture beyond stereotypes and myths to reverence, respect, and honor. Read more about these books in the Weekly this month.



Bethel Presents...


"Raft and Flood: Baptism in Daily Life"

Ceviche—an appetizer of small pieces of raw fish marinated in lime or lemon juice, served with pieces of sweet potato and corn.

Main Course:

Lomo Saltado (made with heef tenderloin)

Aji de Gallina (made with chicken)

Locro de Zapallo (vegetarian option, made with squash)

Dessert:

Arroz con leche y mazamorra morada (rice pudding with purple Peruvian sauce)
